Bodhyfryd School Polisi gwisg ysgol / School uniform policy

Bodhyfryd School Policy is that all children should wear school uniform when attending school or attending events where the child represents the school out of normal school hours.

This policy is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes the sense of pride in our school;
- creates a sense of being part of a community which belongs to the school;
- practical, neat and tidy;
- make all children feel equal in respect of appearance;
- considered as suitable clothing for school which is also good value for money;

The school uniform policy is a core part of the school's commitment towards equal opportunity and inclusion. The school's Governing Body believes that school uniform enables all pupils at the school to share a sense of identity and celebrate characteristics common to everyone, and also respect diversity.

If unsure, you should contact the school office prior to purchasing uniform.

Nursery

We encourage parents or carers to purchase school uniform even when the child is of nursery age. The uniform is as follows:

- black or grey trousers / skirt;
- suitable black shoes
- red or white polo shirt
- red sweatshirt

Reception Class, Year 1 & 2

All children black or grey trousers / skirt red or white polo shirt red school jumper or school cardigan black shoes during the summer season girls may wear school dresses If desired.

Year 3,4,5 and 6

All children black or grey trousers / skirt red or white polo shirt red school jumper or school cardigan black shoes during the summer season girls may wear summer dresses if they wish. Physical Education black shorts polo shirt black plimsolls Add. bag G.

Orders for school uniform may be collected from the school office. You may pay with cash or cheque. As well as clothes, caps, homework bags and PE bags are available.

Name tags on clothes/lost clothes

We encourage parents, carers and children to ensure all clothing is clearly labelled with the child's name. This includes shoes and physical education plimsolls. All unclaimed clothing at the end of each half term will go to a nearby clothes bank or recycled in the school.

Shoes

We encourage children to wear black shoes for school. The shoes should be secure and suitable to play safely on the school yard or school field (summer season). No child should wear high-heeled shoes

Jewellery

The school does not allow children to wear jewellery to school (with the exception of earrings). Children who wear ear-rings must be able to take them out before taking part in a PE session. If this is not possible, the children will be expected to cover up the ear-rings with a plaster. Ear-rings must be in the style of a stud.

If pupils fail to wear the appropriate school uniform:

1. The leadership team or teacher will contact parents or carers to ask for their support in enforcing the uniform code, as agreed in the home/school agreement.

4. If problem still persists, after the time period agreed, the headteacher will contact the parents.
